BAPTIST COLLEGIATE MINISTRY

And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here I am! Send me."

(Isaiah 6:8, ESV)

In the sixth chapter of Isaiah, we get to read the Lord's calling of Isaiah. After Isaiah has seen the beauty and magnificence of the Lord and experienced the saving hand of God, we have this incredible verse where the Lord calls and Isaiah answers. As the Gospel compels, Isaiah responds in faith and declares that he will be the messenger of God. Often times we stop with Isaiah's declaration and celebrate his willingness. However, if one keeps reading, he sees the bleak situation into which Isaiah is to minister. He will be the messenger of the Gospel to people who will not listen, people who will not care, and people who will not respond. Yet, the call is to be faithful – faithful to the one who has called and faithful to the message of the Gospel.

In preparation for a new season of ministry and a new se-



mester of school, I was able to gather with a handful of students, who have expressed interest in being a part of leading the BCM into this next season of ministry. In the midst of excitement and in this results-centered culture, we often expect everything to happen immediately. For Isaiah, this simply was not the case. His message was not immediately received; yet it did not deter him. For him, the call was to faithfulness, not immediate fruitfulness. However, as he was continually faithful, his ministry proved fruitful. As a BCM ministry, I encouraged our leaders that the process of making disciples takes time. My heart is to see BCM be a disciple-making ministry, which means

we will be about the Gospel and making disciples, and often times this process happens slower than what we expect. With this in mind, we must commit to the mission. We must commit to preaching the Gospel and making disciples.

As we begin the semester, we will be focusing on the Gospel and making disciples during our Thursday night gathering time. Additionally students will have the opportunity to learn from other teachers about living the "devoted" life and disciple-making at Converge. Converge is a statewide gathering of students at Kingston Plantation the first weekend of February.
