ALASKA MISSION TRIP OPPORTUNITY

FBC Surfside has a mission trip to Alaska planned!! This trip is for men only (sorry ladies!). They are going to work on a men's retreat center (demolition and renovation at Grizzly Ridge) on the South Kenai Peninsula August 10th-16th. The team will be working with Brenda Crimm www.akmissions.com. Cost of trip is \$600 plus airfare. Included in \$600 is meals, van rental, background check, lodging at Grizzly Ridge in Cooper Landing AK, and one tank of gas. Additional gas will be split up with the group. Flights need to be booked individually ASAP. They are not going as one big group. Currently flights are under \$800. Please make sure you are at the Anchorage airport by 6pm on Aug 10th. **A \$50 deposit is due by April 7th.** Balance is due July 7th.

This is not an FBC Surfside only event. Men from any of our member churches are welcome to participate. Space is LIMITED!! We can only take 50 men. Deadline for the trip is APRIL 7TH or whenever there are 50 participants,, whichever is first.

March ... brings a change of seasons, sunny days, and an array of color! It brings the season of prayer, study, and Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for **North American Missions**. The following is taken from the national WMU website: *Annie Walker Armstrong was the first corresponding secretary (now executive director) of Woman's Missionary Union. Born on July 11, 1850, in Baltimore, Maryland, her family was very active in Baptist life. Annie went with her mother to the missionary meetings of Woman's Mission to Woman; there she learned the importance of giving to and praying for missions and developed a heart for missions. In 1882, Annie helped organize and was first president of the Woman's Baptist Home Mission Society of Maryland.*

On May 14, 1888, women from 12 states met in Richmond, Virginia and formed the Executive Committee of Woman's Mission Societies, Auxiliary to the Southern Baptist Convention. In 1890 the group became Woman's

Missionary Union. In 1934 the offering for the Home Mission Board was renamed the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for Home Missions. Annie Armstrong died on December 20, 1938. Woman's Missionary Union was 50 years old.

As this Season approaches, we trust you will pray, study, and give! Set a goal for the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. Contact the SC WMU Office (800 723-7242) for posters, prayer guides, & envelopes. **Involve** church members in hands-on missions projects. **Consider** organizing a missions trip to help with ministry needs for a North American missionary. **Connect** with one of the week of prayer missionaries or another North American missionary to determine their ministry needs.
