Excerpts from the Declaration of Independence:

WHEN in the Course of human Events, it becomes necessary for one People to dissolve the Political Bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the Powers of the Earth, the separate and equal Station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent Respect to the Opinions of Mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the Separation....**WE** hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness—That to secure these Rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just Powers from the Consent of the Governed, that whenever any form of Government becomes destructive of these Ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its Foundation on such Principles, and organizing its Powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness...And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm Reliance on the Protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our fortunes, and our sacred Honor.

Mission Training Opportunity:

Eye Clinic Training
Lake Murray Baptist Church
Saturday, June 27, 10:00am to 5:00pm
Do you have a heart for world missions? Would you love for your mission team to be able to provide physical and spiritual sight to 3rd world countries? If so, doing an eye clinic is an extremely effective way to demonstrate the love of God in a very tangible way. In a medical clinic, the medication will hopefully help the patient in a few days. In an eye clinic most patients will get instant gratification - one minute his vision is blurred and the next minute he can see!! You will be able to help about 19 patients out of 20 with prescription strength glasses or eye medications. The patient will be more responsive to the gospel after you meet his physical need for better vision. I personally think of how many times, too many to count where I have asked someone on a

mission trip if they have a Bible and they say, "Yes, I do but I can't see it to read it". We can help God's Word come alive for them like it has for us!

Dr. David Curtis is a practicing ophthalmologist in North Carolina who trains layman who do not have any previous medical training or experience to conduct Eye Clinics that will in turn bless thousands of people. He has now been on 49 medical mission trips where he has examined close to 50,000 patients. Now he trains others to conduct eye clinics so that even more can be blessed with better sight.

If you would like to be trained to communicate the love of Jesus Christ through providing eye care to persons in third world environments; and sharing with each patient how they can experience spiritual sight through knowing Christ, then this seminar is for you. The cost is \$80, which covers approximately 8 hours of training, a manual and lunch.

An additional cost is for the refraction equipment which is \$95. (Continued on page 4)

NEWS FROM WACCAMAW WMU

The First Baptist Church of Grove City hosted The Woman's Missionary Union Missions Celebration and Annual Meeting prior to the Southern Baptist Convention June 16-17, 2015, in Columbus, Ohio.

"All for You," based on Mark 8:34 was the theme used by Woman's Missionary Union and continues the 2014-2016 WMU Watchword emphasis: "All for You: Surrender, Sacrifice, Serve."

Debby Akerman of Ocean View Baptist in Waccamaw Association, gracefully and beautifully concluded her fifth and final year as national WMU President as she presided during the meeting, welcomed attendees, addressed the year's theme: "This call of Jesus is an all-or-nothing call; it is a lay-it-all-on-the-line call, a call to surrender, to sacrifice, and to serve" and presided during the meeting, and introduced Linda Cooper of Kentucky as her successor.

WMU Executive Director-Treasurer Wanda Lee said this of Debby: "She's been an articulate speaker of biblical truths, a staunch supporter of all things missions through WMU, and I think one of Debby's greatest contributions may lie in her ability to build relationships with people

across all venues of life." Ms. Lee continued, "She's represented us well with spiritual wisdom and insight that only touches the surface of her own personal walk with the Lord." Lee presented Debby with framed covers of her two books, "Hold On" and "Secrets to Surrender."

Captain Michael Coleman, a U. S. Army Chaplain serving with the North American Mission Board, challenged attendees not only to educate themselves about Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), the social issue of Project HELP (extended for an additional two years) but also to pray for those who are hurting and to be a friend to those who come to churches. "This is not an outreach opportunity for your church," he said. "This is 'inreach.' You can be that back row Baptist who grabs that person by the hand and says no matter what you look like, no matter who you are, I'm going to walk with you along the way."

Arlene Miller, of Crofton, KY, received the Dellanna West O'Brien Leadership Award. North American and International Missionaries shared their stories and inspired attendees.

Three of the six National Acteens Pan-eldists, recipients of a \$1000.00, shared

testimonies of how God impacted their lives through Acteens: Haley Harrison of Charlotte, N. C.; Hydiatu Konneh of Louisville, Ky.; and Ashley Johns of Katy, Texas.

Marion G. "Bud" Fray, retired missionary, shared stories of his service to Zimbabwe and South Africa; he and former missionary Kim Davis have written "Both Feet In: A Journey to Surrender, Sacrifice, and Service." for this year's emphasis book. His last words to attendees were: "Heaven happens when both the almighty Father from heaven and a usable vessel on earth come together. You can be God's instrument for heaven to happen back in your churches."

WMU celebrated the 20th anniversary of the WMU Foundation, and foundation president David George was presented two gifts: a plaque of appreciation and a check for \$2020, significant in that the first "20" is for the vision set before WMU 20 years ago; the second "20" for the vision George is casting for the future.

Will you commit to surrender, sacrifice, and serve more boldly, gracefully, and beautifully?

This equipment is what is used on the mission trip to determine the glasses prescription needed to meet each patient's chief visual complaint. Several people or groups can go in together to purchase this item.

The glasses themselves may be obtained in many ways, from Lions Clubs to church drives, but you can also purchase a materials kit from Dr. Curtis for \$205 which includes 100 pairs of prescription glasses presorted, individually bagged and labeled with marked prescriptions strength. Other than basic reading glasses, donated prescription strength glasses must be read by professional eye glass providers with an auto lensmeter to determine their strength before you take them on a mission trip. So purchasing the glasses presorted saves time and possibly money.
