FROM YOUR DOM

For the last few months we have been looking at habits that characterize exceptionally successful people. These are habits that are possessed by great leaders in the Bible and are scripturally supported. Developing these habits in your daily life can make you a stronger, more effective leader in your home, church and realm of influence. This month I want to describe three more.

Exceptionally successful people are **open-minded**. Webster defines open-minded as “receptive to new ideas or reason.” Many times we can be closed-minded and reject any new ideas or approaches simply because “we’ve never done it this way before.” This may severely limit what we are willing to allow God to do. God’s message remains the same, but the method of getting that message out may change. Think of the story in Acts 10 of Peter’s vision. He saw the vision of the sheet with the beasts, creeping things and birds in it three times and heard the command “Rise, Peter; kill and eat.” Peter’s response each time was “Not so, Lord! For I have never eaten anything common or unclean.” God was getting ready to send the Good News to a group of Gentiles, but because he’d never “done it before”,

Peter immediately rejected this line of thinking. He was not very open-minded. After the arrival of the men from Caesarea, Peter understood that the Lord was doing a new thing and was then receptive to it. As a result, the entire Gentile group at Cornelius’s house was saved! In chapter 11, we see the boldness of Peter as a leader defending his actions and the plan of God. Open-mindedness can produce confidence and effectiveness in leadership.

Exceptionally successful people always **do more than is expected of them**. Many people like to do just enough to get by, and honestly, people with that mind set will likely not be very successful or effective as a leader. In Matthew 5: 38-41, Jesus speaks of turning the other cheek and going the second mile. That’s doing more than expected. Much more. Actions that go beyond the expected speak volumes about the integrity and ethics of an individual, and show the servant heart of a godly, effective leader. Colossian 3:23 reads “And whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to men.” If we truly do all that we do as to the Lord, we will always do more than expected!

Being diplomatic is another habit of exceptionally successful people. What does this mean? Diplomatic people are

marked by sensitivity and use tact when dealing with people. As a result, anything can be said – positive or negative- and the relationship will not be damaged. Think about how Nehemiah was able to get the Jews living in Jerusalem on board to rebuild the wall. He didn’t come in criticizing and complaining. He used diplomacy to appeal to their attitude about being the people of the one true God. He described how God had been at work already and then invited them to be a part of the vision to complete the work: “Come and let us build the wall of Jerusalem, that we may no longer be a reproach.” The result? All the people said, “Let us rise up and build.” They had caught the vision and were ready to follow and be involved. This is how great and effective leaders lead. With diplomacy.

No matter where or who you lead, these habits will contribute to making you more effective and successful. If you strive to develop these habits, I believe you will see the Lord using you in new and amazing ways. God bless you as you continue to reach those in your realm of influence.
