FROM YOUR DOM

For the last few months we have been exploring habits of exceptionally successful people. This month I am finishing up this series.

Exceptionally successful leaders **treat others the way they would like to be treated.** This is commonly called the “Golden Rule.” Jesus said in Matthew 7:12, “*Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them, for this is the law and the prophets,*” giving us this guideline. Instead of lording authority over others, we are to be as ministers or servants to them. When it comes to making a decision involving someone else, it is best to put yourself in their position before making that final decision. Think about how you would like to be treated then treat others that way. People are naturally drawn to those who lead this way.

Highly successful leaders also **maintain a positive attitude.** Rather than seeing the glass half empty, they see it as half full, looking for the best possible perspective. Paul and Silas were able to do this when they were beaten and imprisoned at Philippi. They could have chosen to whine and complain and accuse. Rather they chose to praise God and sing hymns! As a result the Philippian jailer and his entire family were saved! A positive attitude commands attention and usually brings positive results.

Another habit of successful people is that **they don’t make excuses.** If they fail, they don’t try to come up with excuses to explain it away.

They accept responsibility and move forward. If they succeed, they don’t try to make a big deal about it to draw praise and accolades from others. They acknowledge it and quietly move on. When the Lord commanded Moses to lead His people out of Egypt, he came up with excuses – none of which stood up to God. No excuse is good enough. When Nathan came to David, pointing out his transgressions against God with Bathsheba and Uriah, David did not try to defend his actions with poor excuses. He immediately acknowledged that he was wrong and had sinned against the Lord. People can see right through flimsy excuses, but they will have great respect for those who own up to the consequences of their choices.

Lastly, highly successful leaders **focus on godly things and what God desires and requires,** not worldly things and their own desires. Philippians 4:8 describes a list of things we are to think about: things that are true, honest, just, pure, lovely, of good report, virtuous, and praiseworthy. Deuteronomy 10:12 reads “*what doth the LORD thy God require of thee, but to fear the LORD thy God, to walk in all his ways, and to love him, and to serve the LORD thy God with all thy heart and with all thy soul?*” Micah 6:8 states “*He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?*” If we as leaders will keep these things in front of us, endeavoring to live them out, the Lord will be

able to use us and exalt us as the servant leaders He desires us to be.

I trust that as we have studied all of the habits of successful leaders, you have been challenged to develop these habits in your own life and are seeing growth as a result. The following was sent to me by someone who saw it on Facebook, and I thought it was a fitting conclusion to our series. I hope you will read it and think about your own response to it.

Imagine getting to heaven and God saying:

Before I laid the foundations of the earth, I thought of you and of the days you would live on earth. I planned out the people and places I would give you. I laid out your neighbors and your workplace, the places you would attend school, and your family; I laid out enough good days to do all the good works that I purposed for you, and I equipped you with all you would need to accomplish those purposes here. I filled you with my Spirit to encourage and remind you and lead you. I gave you my Word so you would know Me and know what to do. I gave you people to run with and people who needed me.

Let’s talk about how all that went.

1. Jesus modeled. Jesus loved children. Invest in them.
2. Community Improvement. The success of the community is directly related to the success of the local school.
3. Touch Every Life. 97% of an entire generation will flow through a private or public school over the next 20 years and their parents.
4. Open Doors. The SC Dept. of Education is promoting for schools to open their doors for churches who will serve them.
5. Reshapes Reputation. Serving the schools reshapes the reputation that the Lost have about the church in a positive way.

There are three strategic areas to serve in: 1. *Teacher Support and Encouragement.* 2. *Literacy assistance.* 3. *Backpack Program for food distribution.*
